ENGINEERING RFP

Roberts stated that there were two submissions on both projects. The internal scoring matrix led his recommendation to be in favor of TLM and Associates. Roberts stated that they had performed numerous projects for the city and he was confident in their ability to administer these projects. A motion was made by Alderman Lamb to approve the RFQ from TLM and was seconded by Alderman Hardin. All voted aye and the motion carried.

NEW HIRES

Mayor Mabry addressed the board and stated that four new hires were submitted for approval. Mayor Mabry presented Michael Sadler to fill the open position in the Police department. A motion was made by Alderman Lamb to approve the hire and was seconded by Alderman Hardin. All voted aye and the motion carried. Mayor Mabry presented Kelsey Cable, Lydia Adams and Tessa Darnall to fill the open positions in City Hall. A motion was made by Alderman Thomas to approve the hires and was seconded by Alderman Wolf. All voted aye and the motion carried.
